#### Bethany House reopens after shutdown

Bethany House is looking for volunteers to help staff the daily Food Pantry and assist with tasks around the house. We need 3 individuals daily between the hours of 9:30am and 1pm to staff the Food Pantry. We are following the direction of Food Link, so currently we are preparing bags of food and meeting individuals at the door. We provide masks and gloves for volunteers, clean the area daily and do a daily COVID-19 check. We are also looking for teams of individuals to prepare weekday meals\* for the guests (usually somewhere between 7 and 10). Finally, we are hoping to restart our Wednesday prayer service and community meals. For this we need several volunteers to prepare the meals\* and one or two individuals to lead the prayer. "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever dos not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me."

Matthew 10:37-38

#### Reflection:

It's difficult to let go of the things we cherish. We usually want more of what we already possess: more food, more money, more clothes, another house, another car, more perks. We work hard to look prosperous and successful. We enjoy living comfortably and wouldn't have it any other way.

It's even more difficult to let go of the people we love. We have strong ties to our families and friends. We work hard to love the members of our family, to earn their trust, and to maintain good relationships with them. We enjoy the friendships we've made and can't imagine being without them. Some of the greatest moments are the ones we spend with family and friends.

As people of faith, we're asked to value our relationship with Jesus more than family, friends, and possessions. We're asked to surrender all we have, take up the cross, and follow Jesus. We live in a culture that thrives on the belief that the good life is something we find for ourselves rather than something we lose for the sake of Jesus.

Following Jesus demands some lifestyle changes. We must create more space and time for solitude and prayer. We must buy fewer things so we can give more to the poor. We must remind family members and friends that our relationship with Jesus is worth dying for.

Ponder: What am I afraid to lose?

Prayer: Lord, your death on the cross brought life to the world. Help me follow your example of selfless love.

Practice: Today I will be faithful by spending quiet time with Jesus in prayer.

#### Thank you for your generosity!

Offertory envelopes may be placed in the collection basket passed around by the ushers. Please don't touch the baskets when they are passed around. Thank you!

#### Sanitize your hands.

Practice good hand hygiene by washing your hands with soap and water or using alcohol or hand sanitizer. If possible, bring your own bottle for personal use.

#### Observe social distancing.

Observe social distancing at all times, including during Holy Communion.

Please stay 6 feet apart from anyone who does not belong to your household. There will be markers in church to assist with social distancing. We will observe no physical contact for greetings, the Sign of Peace, and the Our Father prayer. We will use our new method for the sign of peace!

Singing by the congregation is discouraged at this time, due to increased respiratory output.

Some entrances and the restrooms will be closed to reduce the areas needing cleaning. We ask that restrooms be used in emergencies only. Please use the front or Edinburgh doors of church to enter.
