BIBLE STUDY CORNER

"Again, the kingdom of heaven is like a merchant in search of fine pearls; on

finding one pearl of great value, he went and sold all that he had and bought it."

Matthew 13:45

Reflection: We value human life. It's our most precious gift. We know from personal experience how fragile life is and how important it is to protect life from mental, emotional, spiritual, and physical harm. We value family life. The family is the foundation of the society; without strong, stable families, children and youth are at risk. We value community life. We rely on our neighbors and friends to support us in times of trouble. We have come to discover that life, family, and community are the pearls of great value necessary for a happy life.

We live in a society where human life, family, and community aren't seen as precious gifts but as commodities to be controlled and manipulated by external forces. The secular world has not interest in the search for the meaning and purpose of life, no regard for the intrinsic dignity of the human person, and no interest in the common good. This is reflected in the endless search for instant gratification, the over-dependency on technology for a sense of belonging, and a growing lack of social responsibility.

As people of faith, we believe the kingdom of heaven is present and active in the earthly world. With the eyes of faith, we can see the kingdom of heaven buried in every life, in every family, and in our relationships with others. We do everything in our power to respond wholeheartedly to the presence of God's kingdom by defending life, showing respect to all people, being compassionate to the poor, and building a just and peaceful world.
