#### **BIBLE STUDY CORNER**

Jesus left that place and went away to the district of Tyre and Sidon. Just then a

Canaanite woman from that region came out and started shouting, "Have mercy on me, Lord, Son of David; my daughter is tormented by a demon.".

Matthew 15:21-22

**Reflection:** We care about our family, neighbors, and friends. We want them to have long, happy, healthy, and good lives. We stand by them when they're mentally, emotionally, spiritually, and physically impaired. We call a doctor when a family member becomes ill. We research community services for a neighbor struggling with addiction. We recommend professional counseling to a friend battling depression. We're able to find the best people and services to help the people we love get well.

We're blessed to have people who care for us when we're tormented by a debilitating condition. We must be aware that people throughout the world are being tormented by disease, malnutrition, dehydration, physical abuse, and oppression. They feel abandoned and have no access to doctors, community services, and counselors. Many people die before food, water, and other relief arrives.

People of faith understand that God's love and compassion transcend boundaries of race, gender, ethnic origin, social background, and religious tradition. We are called to be God's instruments of love and compassion of all people. We must pray for our abandoned, sick, and poor brothers and sisters. We must also work with other concerned groups and provide them with material resources to rebuild their lives, families, and communities.

**Ponder:** Who needs my care and attention at the moment?

**Prayer:** Lord, you offered the healing love and compassion of God to the sick and poor. Help me be an instrument of God's love and compassion to all people.

**Practice:** Today I will be faithful by visiting someone I've neglected.

As much as some folks may not want to admit it, we all want to be healed. Human beings suffer physically, mentally, socially, and spiritually. There are many wounds. position of Music Director to pursue his doctoral studies.



#### WHY ARE CATHOLICS REQUIRED TO GIVE MONEY TO THE CHURCH?

Offering money and other goods to God and the Church is, before all else, a statement of gratitude. We see this when we look at how our spiritual ancestors showed their gratitude to God for the gifts they had received (e.g. Genesis 14:18-20 and Genesis 28:16-22). One of the ways they offered thanks to God was through a practice called "tithing," in which 10 percent of a person's good (crops, livestock, money, etc.) were given back to God.

Today, the practice of tithing—giving 10 percent—is still common in many Protestant communities, but it is not required for Catholics. Instead, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that. "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to [their] own abilities" (no. 2043). This Means that, although we are not bound to practice "tithing" in the traditional sense, we do share a responsibility to share our money or other resources with our



parish communities. Like our spiritual ancestors, we give as a sign of our gratitude for the many gifts that God has given to us. Beyond this, we also share our resources with other Catholic organizations to help them finance their ministries, to continue to grow their outreach to the poor and the needy, and to provide just wages for their employees.

How much we give depends on our individual circumstances, but since we share a responsibility for the programs, outreach, and health of our parish communities and Catholic organizations, this question gives us a wonderful opportunity to ask some important questions about the quality of our giving and what our priorities are. Remember, we are only stewards of our time, talents, and treasures and as the First Letter of Peter reminds us, "As each one of you has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God's varied graces" (4:10).
